Team Arrival

There is limited parking in the main car park at Yorkshire Main FC. Where possible teams are requested to travel to the tournament on foot, by taxi or carpooling to limit the number of cars on-site.

When parking at the tournament, your vehicle is parked at your own risk.

Registration

Team Registration/Player Waiver must be completed on-line at the link below by 5pm on Friday 4th July 2025 and must include the names of all attendees, whether they are playing or not;

Player Eligibility

Players can only play for **ONE** team during the tournament. Crossing over from A to B teams and from WorldNet to Big Tam Vets and vice-versa is strictly prohibited.

The only permitted exception is where players are helping another team get to their full complement of 11 players, as per IFA General Rule 6.4.

Players and Teams which fall foul of this rule risk being expelled from this and future IFA competitions.

Footballs

Two match balls have been allocated to each team. These are your responsibility and you are free to take them with you after the tournament. An electric ball pump is available in the pavilion should footballs require pumping up between matches.

Equality, Diversity & Inclusion

We gladly welcome all participants regardless of race, religion, gender, sexual orientation or any other protected characteristic. The abuse of any participant or official, either in person or on social media platforms, will not be tolerated under any circumstances.

Any participant, supporter or team that fails to extend this welcome to their fellow participants are not welcome to take part in this or any other IFA activity.

Match Conditions

As stated in the Tournament Programme, the Match Conditions are as per the standard Laws of the Game, with the following exceptions:

Playing Time – all matches are to be played over two periods of fifteen minutes, with a maximum five-minute half-time break - but referees have been advised to keep these to around 2 minutes.

Knockout Stage Extra Time – one Ten Minute period of "Golden Goal" extra time shall be played in the knockout stages in matches where scores are level at the end of normal time

Penalty Shoot Out – where Extra Time fails to provide a winner in a Knockout Stage match, the match will be decided by a Penalty Shoot Out. Only players on the pitch at the end of Extra Time are eligible to participate in the Shoot Out

Substitutions – teams are permitted to make unlimited substitutions on a maximum of three occasions during each match on a "rolling substitutes" basis. Half-time substitutions are in addition and are unlimited. Substituted players should leave the field of play at the closest possible point to speed up the game. In the event of Golden Goal Extra Time, one additional substitute occasion can be used. In the event of any injury to a player after the permitted occasions, one additional substitute can be used.

Disciplinary - In the unlikely event of a player receiving a sending off or two bookings they will miss their team's next match. In the case of any sending off, this should be reported to the Organisers by the official and further disciplinary measures may be enforced.

<u>Kits</u>

Kit clashes should be prevented by communicating prior to the tournament and messages have been sent to all team organisers to enable these conversations with the other teams drawn in your group.

WorldNet Knockout Phase

Teams will be positioned in their group table by Points Scored. If two or more teams have earned the same number of points, Goal Difference, Goals Scored, Head-to-Head record between the two teams and finally a Coin Toss will be used, in that order, to separate teams.

The draw for the knockout stage will take place at the close of play on the Saturday evening in the Pavillion. The draw will be communicated by broadcast message.

8 teams will qualify for the Cup competition. The 1st and 2nd placed team in each group along with the two best 3rd placed teams.

The remaining 4 teams will qualify for the Plate competition.

In both competitions, unless unavoidable, teams who have played against each other in the group stage cannot be drawn against each other in the first knockout stage.

BigTamVets Rules

As per standard WorldNet rules, with the addition of:

At least NINE players MUST be at least THIRTY-FIVE YEARS OLD during all action of the BigTamVets tournament. We expect all teams to fully respect this rule and the legacy of our BigTamVets tournament.

BigTamVets Knockout Phase

The winners of each group will receive a bye to the quarter final joined by the best 2nd place team. All other teams will be drawn at random to determine their qualifier fixture. Unless unavoidable, teams who have played against each other in the group stage cannot be drawn against each other in the first knockout stage.

Health & Safety Information

It is each team manager's responsibility to ensure the following precautions are taken and processes followed.

While many of these may be second nature to you and your teams already, please ensure these are shared with your players before you arrive at the tournament.

If any team manager has any questions, please contact the organisers on the details provided.

- 1. Team managers are responsible for collating emergency contact and next of kin information for all players.
- 2. Team registration form MUST be completed and returned, without exception.
- 3. In the event of hot weather, teams are advised to take plenty of fluids on board to avoid dehydration, and to use sun cream.
- 4. In the event of extreme weather, tournament organisers and referees will make appropriate decisions, if necessary.
- 5. No Glass Items are permitted at the tournament venue.
- 6. Teams are reminded to ensure that all players warm-up and cool down before and after games, to minimise the risk of injury.
- 7. Each team should bring a basic first aid kit, including hand sanitiser, plasters in various sizes, sterile gauze dressings in various sizes, triangular and crepe rolled bandages, sterile gloves, cleansing wipes, safety pins and tweezers.
- 8. First Aid staff will be on site and based in the Pavilion. In the unlikely event of being unable to locate them, please contact the tournament organisers in the Organisers WhatsApp group immediately.
- 9. Report any and all accidents/injuries to tournament organisers in the Organisers WhatsApp group immediately.
- 10. Report any and all potential slip/trip/fall/injury hazards in car parks, changing rooms, on pitches and walkways to tournament organisers in the Organisers WhatsApp group immediately.
- 11. All jewellery is to be removed before players take the field of play. Referees will perform checks before matches.
- 12. Appropriate footwear must be worn at all times. Players are advised to bring various pairs of boots to ensure they can react to changing pitch conditions across the weekend.
- 13. Parents will be responsible for the behaviour of any children attending at all times. In the event of a child becoming lost/separated from their parents, please contact the tournament organisers in the Organisers WhatsApp group immediately.
- 14. In the extremely unlikely event of any medical emergency, assault or physical violence taking place, tournament organisers must be contacted immediately.

- 15. BBQ's and Pyrotechnics of all types are not permitted anywhere within the Yorkshire Main Complex. Any team using pyrotechnics' (both Flares and Smoke Bombs) will face instant expulsion from this and future tournaments.
- 16. Team Managers must ensure that their team uses the Yorkshire Main Complex in a clean and tidy way. Each pitch will have 2 x Bin Bags for empty bottles and any other rubbish you may have. Once they are full, please let the tournament organisers know so that we can remove and replace them.
- 17. Smoking is only permitted at the side of the Pavilion. Please use this area if you wish to smoke.

<u>Injuries</u>

The IFA and its competitions are not registered or affiliated to the FA or any other body, and as such is not covered under the FA's general insurance terms. The IFA cannot be held responsible for any injury or loss sustained by individuals taking part in IFA competitions. All players compete at their own risk and by taking part accept that this is the case. Players may wish to consider taking out individual insurance cover in the event that they may suffer such injury or loss.

IFA Spirit

The IFA Spirit is our interpretation of the way in which we like our games to be played. One thing is not in any doubt – The aim of the IFA has always been and always will be to build bridges between groups of fans of different clubs by playing a friendly game of football. We know that everyone wants to win while wearing their team shirt, but the focus is on the true meaning of the word friendly, rather than the usual footballing meaning, throughout the WorldNet & Big Tam Vets weekend.

Put simply, we encourage good natured banter between our teams and believe games should be played with smiles on faces. This means there should be no handbags with the opposition, no disputing decisions with referees or linesmen and no arguing with or abusing opponents, team-mates or match officials. If a decision goes against your team, the captain or manager should have a word with the referee where appropriate and if you foul an opponent you are expected to pick them up if needed, or shake their hand.

We're not naïve – We all know those little moments that can flare up in a game of football, and no-one is expecting such Corinthian spirit to shine through 100% of the time. But the IFA has survived this long because it's different from the average football league and it's up to every player, every manager and every team to ensure flare-ups are dealt with quickly if and when they happen.

We allow rolling subs for this very reason – if someone on your team is acting up, sub them for ten minutes. That sharpens the mind more than a yellow card! Ask persistent offenders to change their ways or find something else to do in Doncaster this weekend.

So please bear in mind your responsibilities to the IFA's good name, whenever you represent your club. We are very clear about equality of opportunity and all players and those involved in IFA football should not only be aware of our rules regarding this, but should also do everything in their power to uphold those rules.

Everyone of us is responsible for this.
